- 1. Pray for wisdom from the Holy Spirit for understanding God's Word.
- 2. Read James 1:1-4 aloud several times.

3. Observe

- 1. Mark any words or phrases that stand out.
- 2. Write down any questions that arise from the text.
- 3. Notice that God and the Lord Jesus Christ are placed side by side (1:1). Find a few other verses in the New Testament where God and Jesus Christ occur side by side.
- 4. In v. 2, what does the word "when" or "whenever" (vs. "if") tell us about trials?
- 5. Note the progression from "trials" to "complete" and the relationships between various words in vv. 2-4. Draw a diagram indicating these relationships.

5. Interpret / Live out the Word

- 1. What is your first reaction to the command "count it all joy" when you face trials?
- 2. Think about your own experiences going through times of trials, suffering, and pain. What have you learned from such experiences?
- 3. Considering that joy (*chara*) is closely related to grace (*charis*), how can we be joyful in the midst of trials?
- 4. Why does God sometimes allow trials, suffering, and pain?
- 5. Do you have some means (spiritual disciplines/exercises) to strengthen yourself for the times of trial?
- 6. How would you pray when you are going through such trials? Write down your prayer.
- 7. What is the one thing you would like to work on from the insights you gained?
