- 6. How much time and resources have you devoted to caring for the least in our society ("orphans and widows")?
- 7. Set aside time during the week to listen attentively to the still small voice of God. Carry the posture of listening to other relationships.
- 8. What is the one thing you would like to work on from the insights you gained?
