- 1. Who have been examples to you in the way they faced suffering? What have you learned from their lives?
- 2. In what areas of your life do you wish to become more patient? What do you think are the root causes of your impatience in those areas?

- 4. How does the Lord's coming or His nearness motivate you to be more patient during trying times?
- 5. What are some spiritual disciplines or practical exercises to engage in to help you become more patient?
- 6. Why do you think James follows his teaching on patience with the seemingly unrelated teaching on speech (5:12)? What might be the relationship between 5:7-11 and 5:12?
