- 1. Pray for wisdom from the Holy Spirit for understanding God's Word.
- 2. Read Colossians 1:1-8 aloud slowly several times.

3. Observe

- 1. Mark any words or phrases that stand out.
- 2. Write down any questions that arise from the text.
- 3. Consider the prevalence of the words for the Triune God: Father, Jesus, Christ, Spirit. What does it suggest about the main themes of Colossians?
- 4. Note the triad of faith, love, and hope (1:4-5) and compare it with the same triad in 1 Corinthians 13:13 and 1 Thessalonians 1:3, 5:8.

5. Interpret / Live out the Word

- 1. Knowing that this letter was written in a Roman prison, how would you read it differently?
- 2. Usually, it would be awkward to say that we are "in a person." What does it mean to be "in Christ" (1:2, 4)?
- 3. What would our heart and mind be like if we were not "in Christ"?
- 4. Notice the reasons for the Apostle Paul's thankfulness in prayer (1:3-6). In your prayer life, what are you primarily thankful for?
- 5. The words "faith, love, and hope" (1:4-5) are often misunderstood; for example, faith as assent to certain doctrines, love as romantic feelings, and hope as optimism. How would you define them biblically?
- 6. From whom did you first hear the Gospel and come to understand "God's grace" (1:6-7)? Who was your Epaphras?
- 7. In what ways are you helping someone understand "God's grace"?
