1. Pray for wisdom and understanding that come from the Holy Spirit.

2. Read Colossians 1:18-23 aloud slowly several times.

3. Observe

- 1. Mark any words or phrases that stand out.
- 2. Write down any questions that arise from the text.
- 3. List the statements from this passage about who Christ is (His Being) and what Christ has done (His acts).
- 4. Note the words "all" and "every" (9 times in 1:15-23) and what they point to.

5. Interpret / Live out the Word

- 1. What did it cost God to reconcile us to Himself? What does it reveal about the character of God?
- 2. In other religions, such as Islam, are they concerned about reconciliation with God? In Islam, what must they do to enter heaven?
- 3. Why is Jesus Christ *the only way* to be reconciled to God?
- 4. What is the difference between forgiveness and reconciliation? Is it possible to forgive (or be forgiven) and not be reconciled?
- 5. In light of Christ's reconciling work, how would you live differently in your relationships with others?
- 6. Based on the Christ Hymn (1:15-20), how would you summarize the Gospel in a few sentences or less?
- 7. This passage ends with a conditional statement: "if you continue in your faith ..." (1:23a). What are some ways to help you continue in your faith and not move away from the hope?
