- 3. Mark the names of people whom the Apostle Paul mentions in this text. What do you know about each one of them from the rest of the New Testament?
- 4. What qualities does the Apostle Paul note in each person?
- 4. Watch the Video Lesson on YouTube.

5. Interpret / Live out the Word.

- 1. Think about what you pray for in your daily prayers. What do your prayers reveal about your priorities?
- 2. What can we learn from the prayer requests of the Apostle Paul (4:3-4)? How can our prayers reflect God's heart for the world?
- 3. Note the qualities that the Apostle Paul affirms in the people. Which of these qualities would you like to develop in your life?
- 4. The people mentioned in 4:7-11 "have proved a comfort" to the Apostle Paul. How can you be a comfort to pastors, ministers, and spiritual leaders?
- 5. Reflect on the widespread missionary movements driven by ordinary disciples of Jesus during the Apostle Paul's time. How do you see yourself participating in such movements in your situation today?
- 6. How do you balance the internal needs of the church and God's calling for the church (called out into God's harvest field for the sake of the lost)?
- 7. Do you have a purpose that transcends yourself? If so, what are you doing to fulfill that purpose?
